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Foreword to deliverable 110

This document presents the second Annual Dissemination Plan for year 2022 of EUt+ initiative under the Work Package 8 (WP8) – Sustainability and Dissemination D8.5c. Annual Dissemination Plan is continuation of D8.5a.b Annual Dissemination Plan concluded in 2021.

The Annual Dissemination Plan of 2021 was intended to be an experimental framework and to ensure an effective dissemination of all relevant activities and results allowing it to undergo improvements and updates throughout the year and be a starting point for the dissemination plan of the following year.

This second Annual Dissemination Plan of 2022 involved all members in a proactive dissemination action, to maximise the international visibility of EUt+, which should be achieved by participating in relevant conferences and events, publishing project results, scientific publications, other activities and events. It was planned that the Annual Dissemination Plan would be adopted and included in the workflow by each task leader of the EUt+ and the results of the institutional experimentation, its profile and model as well as the content developed will be efficiently disseminated to all external stakeholders, including other EU alliances, already starting from the first year of the initiative. While planning and executing dissemination it has been up most importance to consider:

- + The ambition of the EUt+ initiative.
- + The fact that the task 8.5 is generating completely new cooperation mechanism.
- The understanding of the dissemination in general to implement a dissemination plan.























Other grants that support the growth of the EUt+ alliance.

The plan for the year 2022 was introduced in January, including the EUt+ Dissemination Guidelines created to ensure that all EUt+ members would be aligned about EUt+ Dissemination, understanding of the dissemination in general and how to implement the dissemination plan.























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Introduction

Proper dissemination is key for EUt+. Not only it serves to share knowledge, outcomes, and innovations with a wider audience, thereby maximizing the impact of the initiative, but it is necessary also to introduce the new model of education that EUt+ envisions. Moreover, EUt+ needs to engage a very large number of participants to exit. Dissemination in EUt+ facilitates knowledge exchange and learning, allowing EUt+ researchers, other organizations, and communities to build upon the project's work, advancing collective understanding and driving further innovation. Additionally, dissemination improves the quality of the alliance, as it promotes transparency and accountability. Stakeholders external to EUt+ will be able to evaluate the project's outputs, its effectiveness and foster a culture of meeting the objectives, fostering trust and collaboration. It helps in fundraising and other relations with external stakeholders, thus improving the chances of receiving funds for future projects. Successful dissemination can attract the attention of potential partners or sponsors, increasing the likelihood of continued financial and logistical support. Another key aspect in EUt+ is the principle of multilingualism and interculture learning. Project dissemination also encourages cross-cultural and cross-border collaborations, breaking down geographical barriers, thus support a more intercultural learning environment.

This annual report introduces the main guidelines for dissemination in EUt+, the plan for 2022, and results achieved. The outputs show the growing interest of EUt+, despite the complications caused by the Covid pandemic. Next steps for 2023 are also introduced in the report. Finally, main conclusions are described.

















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1. Dissemination guidelines

In order to fully understand dissemination and to implement a dissemination plan equally at all partners, the EUt+ team has generated EUt+ Dissemination Guidelines for all partners.

The Dissemination Plan was depicted in two dissemination workshops. The main questions at the first dissemination workshop were:

- dissemination strategy
- + work organisation
- + what Is Considered «Result»
- + monitoring tools.

The second dissemination workshop went more in-depth into the topics at hand, and the main topic of the workshop was "Planning/Monitoring Tool". The work plan of the dissemination workshop goes as follows:

WORK PLAN

Dissemination activities are planned in accordance with the development, overall progress and milestones achieved in each separate work package

After delivering tangible/intangible result it should be disseminated as soon as possible in the most appropriate way from the task responsible and/or the WP manager point of view

- +Planned in advance
- ◆Reporting via entry in Dissemination tool in end of each month – NEED A PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS!!!!
- Implementation of the chosen dissemination activities
- Reporting once again participant statistics, accurate date, ect

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Based on the outputs of these meetings, EUt+ Dissemination Guidelines were created. They are the following:

1.1 How to Reference EUt+ and the Commission (extract from the Grant Agreemnt)

As mentioned in the EUt+ Grant Agreement,

unless the Agency requests or agrees otherwise, any communication (or dissemination) activity related to the action (including at conferences, seminars, in information material, such as brochures, leaflets, posters, presentations, etc., in electronic form, via social media, etc.) and any infrastructure, equipment or major result funded by the grant must display the EU emblem and include the following text: "Co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union"

When displayed in association with another logo, the EU emblem must have appropriate prominence.

On publications which are part of the action, the EU emblem and text must appear on the cover or the first pages after the editor's name. At events which are part of the action, the EU emblem and text must be displayed on signs and posters.

Any communication activity or study written related to the action must indicate the following disclaimer:

"The content of this [insert appropriate description, e.g. report, publication, conference, etc.] represents the views of the author only and is his/her sole responsibility. The European Commission and the Agency do not accept any responsibility for use that may be made of the information it contains."

1.2 Distinction between Communication and Dissemination

Dissemination























Dissemination is a planned process of providing information on the results of programmes and initiatives to key actors. It occurs as and when the result of programmes and initiatives become available. In terms of the Erasmus+ Programme this involves spreading the word about the project successes and outcomes as far as possible. Making others aware of the project will impact on other organisations in the future and will contribute to raising the profile of the organisation carrying out the project. Exploitation is (a) a planned process of transferring the successful results of the programmes and initiatives to appropriate decision-makers in regulated local, regional, national or European systems, on the one hand, and (b) a planned process of convincing individual end-users to adopt and/or apply the results of programmes and initiatives, on the other hand. For Erasmus+ this means maximising the potential of the funded activities, so that the results are used beyond the lifetime of the project. Sharing the results will enable others to benefit from the activities and experiences of the Erasmus+ Programme. Moreover, in the sense of this initiative, dissemination covers both the previously mentioned terms and is perceived as a process of making results available for the audiences that would be in the interest to make use of the particular results.

Communication

Communication is a broader concept and includes information and promotion activities to raise awareness and enhance the visibility of the project's activities in addition to the dissemination and exploitation of the project results. However, dissemination and exploitation of results will form a crucial part of communication activities taking place during the lifetime of the initiative and beyond.














Some examples of dissemination activities are (but are not limited to):

- + Peer reviewed research outputs. In the scope of the next year of the initiative each task should include a dissemination aspect, and this encourages all sorts of research outputs from this particular initiative of EUt+ and they should include all forms of peer review for including peer reviewed journal article, conference papers, exhibitions, performances, artefacts, monographs, collected editions.
- + Policy documents/ White papers. Any document which is written as a policy document for national of European agencies or presented at policy conferences.
- + Technology transfer training/seminar/webinar/workshop for sharing the practices, results of the technology Lab, etc.
- + Networking Presentations. Similar to "sharing practices" to other external stakeholders, alliances and potential partners who are willing to take part in other EU Alliances.
- + Conferences papers, which are peer reviewed.
- Events with the key stakeholders, which disseminate the deliverables of EUT+.
- + Performances/Exhibitions/demonstrations. All performances which are considered to be curated nationally or internationally are peer reviewed under the EU funding schemes for example, national concerts hall performances, international exhibitions (Tate modern, Venice biannale in visual arts, architecture).























- Digital Objects and Data sets. A digital object as a research output includes the data set of the object and the graphics of the object, in Design the research output can be the object but also the process of the object as a digital artefact. At task level teams should identify which data-sets may be collected, and which may be useful out of EUt+ (and consequently worth being aired).
- + New technology or programme documentation. Any written text, illustrations or video that describe a technology or program to its users.
- + Additional dissemination activities. Some examples may include (but not limiting to these): podcasts, infographics, blog posts about project results, dedicated online discussion which are public dissemination of deliverable, etc.).

1.4 Guidelines

When a task achieves something that is considered a result (even if not the final one), task manager should prepare a dissemination activity for it (this should be planned well in advance).

Results are achievements of the project. A result is a product or output which is produced by a given initiative and which may be quantified. Results should be developed in such a way that they can be tailored to the needs of others; transferred to new areas; sustained after the funding period has finished; or used to influence future policy and practice. As per Erasmus+ guide tangible results may include, for example, an approach or a model to solve a problem; a practical tool or product, such as handbooks, curricula, e-learning tools; research reports or studies; good practice guides or case studies; evaluation reports; recognition certificates; Intangible results may include, for example, knowledge and experience gained by























participants, learners or staff; increased skills or achievements; improved cultural awareness; better language skills.

The choice of the activity will be decided by the task manager/responsible for the specific deliverable on a case-by-case basis (considering the nature of the result and target audiences/end users, the target of the activity - share knowledge, result or a technique, etc.), and should give clear answers to following questions:

- What will be disseminated (information, example of practice, resource, etc.)
- + Who are the target audience/end user of the result?
- + How the result will be disseminated?
- When it is going to happen?
- + How you will evaluate the activity carried out?

Dissemination activity should be carried out as soon as possible, but prior to send a communication to a conference, journal, or any other mean for airing project results, task manager must verify that dissemination regulations (inclusion of logos, reference to funding projects, etc.) are in place and report to the T8.5 working group (Dissemination team) about the planned dissemination activity and the status of it with an entry in the Dissemination monitoring tool at the same time informing the Communication Central about the progress of the task.

After the activity has been carried out, impact assessment of the dissemination activity has to be done and results of it shared, if there are such with both - Dissemination team and the Communication Central.

Dissemination team will monitor the xls. tool on a regular basis and have a reporting meeting every three months with the relevant task managers and/or the responsible of the deliverable (considering the initial timeline for deliverables for the last three months of the initiative).























After the reporting meetings, it is responsibility of the Dissemination team to gather results of the EUt+ and prepare an action plan and updates to the EUt+ Annual Dissemination plan if necessary.

Dissemination team shall also provide inputs to the Communication Central on regular basis so the latter can prepare a press release note and/or other communication activity, dedicated to a wider/different audience, featuring the information that can be made public.

2.Report of the 2nd year

2.1 Summary of results from the 2nd year

The annual dissemination plan for the actions and results envisaged under the European initiative, was designed within the frame of WP8 as a supporting guide, an open and "live" working tool that aids all project partners, on January year 2022.

Despite the efforts within the task and the engagement of task managers and output makers, 2022 still suffered the consequences of the Covid pandemic difficulties. This, together with other obstacles such as force major situations, different academic and administrative approaches as well as cooperation issues etc., have led to variable delays in the different tasks and/or actions within the initiative so the EUt+ Dissemination plan has been adapted to the situations. In result, the total number of dissemination actions in 2022 was 81, which is a good result but not as ambitious as we foresaw.

TRANSVERSAL WORKSHOP

The main purpose is to define all the actions to be implemented to accompany the experience of the first pioneer students enrolled in September in the EUt+ curricula, prefiguration of the European EUt+ programs.























The objective of these working sessions was to ensure better coordination of our EUt+ activities in the deployment of action plans that are all related to supporting the student experience.

In this respect, about twenty European representatives of the workpackages WP5.1, WP 2.1 and WP7.1 will cross their approach and their action plans in order to mutualize and harmonize them and to make them a reality in the short term.

Students were invited to participate to the working sessions in order to adapt the proposals to their uses and needs.

Some participants to the WP3 from UTT involved in the creation of "Mobilty maps" come to answer questions and participate in the reflection on how to involve the teaching units' managers involved in the first clusters. They are the pioneers.

SECOND DATA SCIENCE INSTITUTE WORKSHOP

Within the frame of the EUt+ week, we are organizing a workshop on "Data Science and Applications". This workshop is a good opportunity to foster further the collaboration within the recently established EUt+ Data Science Lab.

We cordially invite PhD students to contribute a poster presentation on their research. The workshop features 2 teaching sessions and one dedicated PhD presentation session. Contributions will be published in EUt+ Academic Press.

RIGA WEEK























In the week of the 160th anniversary of Riga Technical University (RTU), the partners of the emerging European University of Technology (EUt +) meet for the first time in Riga - eight universities have joined forces to create a completely new internationally competitive technical university in Europe. During the meeting, the partner universities will discuss issues related to student mobility, curriculum development, university cooperation with industry, as well as a panel discussion on ethics in innovation creation.

As the global competition between higher education institutions intensifies, European universities are forming alliances and forming common higher education institutions to offer competitive content and participate in the global education market.

At a working meeting in Riga, the EUt+ university management discused the content of the new study programs and the development of a single European degree. The new degree is developed in five thematic clusters – Civil Engineering, Telecommunications, Industrial Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Architecture. It is not just the creation of joint study programs, but a completely new concept - the next generation of study programs with completely new content based on transversal competencies, collaboration with industry, the creation of student mobility maps, ethics, inclusive principles, the social dimension, sustainability.

As both the new university itself and the study programs are considered to be innovations, the EUt+ partners want to discuss the ethical aspects of innovation at the Riga meeting. On the 30th of June, at 13:30 there was a panel discussion "Ethical and responsible innovation", where ethical aspects will be discussed from the legal, economic, as well as the institutional aspects of the state.

The EUt+ meeting in Riga is the consortium's regular monthly meeting, as the partner universities meet every month at one of the eight universities.























Approximately 100 guests from EUt+ member universities arrived in Riga for the working week. On the 1st of July, guests are invited to take part in the 160th anniversary event of RTU in Mežaparks, where both the traditional RTU Grand Graduation, a festive concert and an exhibition of products and prototypes developed by RTU scientists and students are planned.

2.5 Conferences

2ND EUROPEAN CULTURE AND TECHNOLOGY LAB+ ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The second annual conference hosted by the European University of Technology and organised by the European Culture and Technology Laboratory 'ECT Lab+' aimed to bring together experts from the Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Technology and other fields proposing ways of moving beyond the Anthropocene by negating the tendency which has led to its development.

Keynote speaker: Yves Citton (Université Paris 8)

The proposals (which include artistic interventions) for the conference should address selected areas that focus on the relation between technology, care, and the (Neg) Anthropocene. The challenge today is to propose ways of living together that account for the paradoxes and hierarchies of care; ways of invention and innovation that take into consideration the questions and needs of care - care for the self, care for the other than self, and care for the planet.

For example: the horizon of 'becoming human' is challenged by the development of contemporary technology such as planetary computational regimes, where the ability to attend is harvested as a commodity, where the ability to attend to the other is monetized with a 'double click', where knowledge itself is undermined by the speed and spread of information. The role of the University in this context is to























develop modes and means of deep attention. Profound care is needed, and this can only take place by reinventing and entangling knowledge systems through transdisciplinary practices.

The double etymology of sercuritas as care and security will be the focus of the conference this year, the security of food, and the security of 'European values' such as social democracy. With the current krisis of European democracy and the war in Ukraine, the global shift of a new geopolitical era has begun. The questions of security and care are now central to concerns about the impact of climate collapse. The context of growing insecurity, which is both geopolitical and physical, has led to the expansion of ecological questions of caring; caring for the planet, caring for the other, and caring for the self. The ECT Lab+ is proposing a threefold framework of three ecologies to explore the question of security from the individual ecology, collective ecology and planetary ecology.

1ST EUT+ CONFERENCE ON LANGUAGES – INTER/MULTICULTURALISM IN A POST COLONIAL ERA: LANGUAGES AND EUROPEAN VALUES

Language has the ability to impact and transform while itself being impacted and transformed. It is a core part of the EUt+, and the conference will seek to create dialogue, generate new knowledge and understanding, research, and awareness on language and various themes related to languages. A special focus will be put on topics such as intercultural communication, multiculturalism, European values and post colonialism.

European integration and globalisation have had extensive impact on the education systems of the EU member states. Tertiary institutions have implemented new study programs or have even restructured their degrees to align with European integration and values. Methods of teaching and modes of language learning have also























developed and have increasingly become ethnically and culturally diverse and focused.

At the same time, language education and approaches may still reflect European values and positions and may not take language and culture in postcolonial and indigenous countries, groups and areas into consideration. Discourse on languages, learning, teaching and administrative practices may afford valuable insights in the above points.

This event is an interdisciplinary environment that will afford the unique opportunity of persons from all area of tertiary education to share and discuss their experiences, ideas and research relating to language and its interplay with intercultural communication, European values and post colonialism.

Participants had the possibility to forge contacts, network, and facilitate partnerships across the EUt+ campuses.

The EUt+ invites researchers, scholars, representatives of and indigenous persons, practitioners, administrators, and graduate students, to submit abstracts for its first annual conference on languages.

Conclusion

This 2022 annual report shows the dissemination plan and its results during the year. The guidelines and methodology built in the task enabled task managers and researchers to have a guideline for the dissemination, and for the task team to collect the numerous dissemination outputs of the project. This was particularly challenging, as the number of participants in the EUt+ alliance at the end of 2022 was nearly 1000.

The number of dissemination outputs was lower than planned, as the nature of the dissemination events directly suffered the consequences of the Covid pandemic. Physical conferences, workshops, events with policy makers, etc. resumed in 2022, still with many doubts about its feasibility. Nevertheless, the targets were reached or almost reached for most of the expected output types. WP2 (dedicated to multilingualism, equity, diversity, and inclusion) and WP7 (including communication and global outreach) were the work packages that contributed the most to dissemination. WP4, dedicated to research also produced a relevant number of outputs, although lower than initially expected. Regarding the partners, the work was done in a collaborative and appreciative manner, with many contributions from all. Globally, the task outcomes were aligned with its objectives and the main target audiences were reached.
