

EUT+ GENERAL TASK REVIEW WORKSHOP COMMENCES IN DUBLIN

Delegates from across Europe have arrived in Dublin for the European University of Technology (EUT+) General Task Review workshops taking place in TU Dublin this week. Over 100 attendees from the eight EUT+ partner Universities have gathered on TU Dublin's campus in Grangegorman to share their progress so far and discuss EUT+ priorities for the future.

The attendees were welcomed to Grangegorman by the **President of TU Dublin, Professor David FitzPatrick**, in an opening address where he spoke about the historical significance of the Grangegorman Campus, the development so far, and the University's plans for more buildings in the coming years.

Professor Timothée Toury, Corporate Secretary of EUT+, took the stage to present a plan to accelerate the development of the process of integration into a single European university. With the success of the first 18 months, each partner has agreed to approach their national ministries in order to start designing a common European legal structure to accelerate the convergence process.

The morning session ended with a panel discussion, facilitated by Ali Warner, Jam Productions, on the meaning of education, featuring contributions from **Professor Noel Fitzpatrick**, a Philosopher from the TU Dublin School of Creative Arts and European Culture and Technology Lab+ lead, **Dr Kevin C. O'Rourke**, Enterprise Partnership Lead with Convene, **Margaret Kinsella**, an Informatics Lecturer in TU Dublin and **Prof. Shannon Chance**, Programme Chair, BIM (Digital Construction) at TU Dublin and education researcher. Then, after a brief morning break, the hard work commenced with presentations from Task Managers and Liaisons from across the Eight Working Packages.
